ed to be 14 million, 2 per cent below April and the lowest May total since 1941.

Pullets added to the flocks in the state during May totaled 3 per cent of the laying numbers. This was a little below average.

Egg prices continued to decline. The May average dropped 3 cents below April and at 32 cents per dozen equaled the low level of May last year. Feed prices remained relatively steady from last month. The egg-feed ratio dropped to 86 which equaled lowest ratio on record.

Compared last Friday, Slaughter Steers grading Good and Better unevenly 150-250 higher; small supply Standard and Low Good and weights under 1050 lbs generally 50 to 100 higher; Heifers 100-200 higher; Cows strong to 50 higher, Bulls steady. In the Chicago carlot dressed trade, Good and Choice steer 150-250 higher, Standard 100-150 up, Heifer Beef 175-225 higher, Cow Beef mostly steady.

Prices on Slaughter Steers and Heifers registered the sharpest one week advance in three years under influence of curtailed marketings and sharply higher wholesale beef prices. Total marketings first four days at the twelve markets smallest since March and local receipts smallest for a non-holiday in over a year.

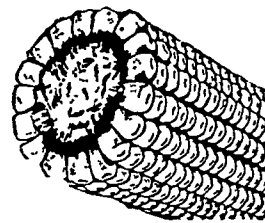
