Bag Limits Set By Commission

The establishment of seasons and bag limits for the 1964 hunting license year, which begins September 1, was the main order of business of the Pennsylvania Game Commission at its recent meeting in Harrisburg. Other items of interest to sportsmen and the public were considered and resolved.

A two-day statewide antlerless deer season with an allocation of 274,800 licenses, 70,350 more than last year, was set for December 14 and 15. An innovation, announced by the Commission, will be an extension of this season through December 19 in parts of certain southeastern counties. Another innovation, possible under a 1963 amendment to the Game Law, is the prescribing of the type of firearm and ammunition to be used in the designated parts of Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery Counties. Still another innovation announced by the Commission is a post-season for archers in Allegheny County and in southeastern Pennsylvania between the Delaware and Susquehanna Rivers and south of Route 22, January 4-9, 1965. This is in addition to the archer's October deer season, October 3-30.

Prior to establishing the 1964 seasons, the eight Members of the Commission met last Saturday, June 13, with representatives of statewide organizations and agencies interested in Pennsylvania's wildlife resources. Only twelve of the twenty-four groups invited to appear at the meeting to offer

recommendations were represented.

The antlered deer season of two weeks and one-week bear season are the same as last year.

Small game seasons and bag limits for 1964 are similar to 1963. The area for the longer season on turkeys, October 31—November 21, was modified slightly and is now completely defined by highways and rivers instead of partly by county lines. This should make it easier for hunters to observe the prescribed boundaries. The shorter season, October 31—November 14, was again set for the more accessible turkey range in order to maintain ample wild breeding stock to support future hunting. The extended season, December 26—January 2, 1965, was again listed for cottontail rabbits, squirrels and grouse. During this same period, snowshoe hares will be legal and in contrast to the last several years, there are no counties closed.

Trapping seasons for furbearers are similar to last year. The liberalized beaver harvest in certain counties was continued to control flat-tail numbers and alleviate damage complaints.

Judges Named For Dairy Show

HARRISBURG — Six nationally known dairy authorities from as many different states today were named to judge the first Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show, Sept. 14-17, in the State Farm Show Building, Harrisburg.

By breed, they are: Ayrshire, John Morris, University of Maryland, College Park, Md.; Brown Swiss, George Trimmer, Cornell University, Ithaca, N. Y.; Guernsey, Lee Yost, Wyno Farms, Muncy, Pa.; Holstein, Dr John I. McKittrick, Welcome Inn Farms, Dublin, O.; Jersey, Thomas O. Harris, Carrollton, Ky.; Milking Shorthorn, Stuart Rowe, Davis R1, Calif.

Harold R McCulloch, show manager, said a premium list will be ready for distribution by mid-July and that entries will close Aug 15. Cash premiums will total \$45,000, with Holsteins topping the breed totals at \$8,950. Premiums for the other breeds will be Guernsey, \$8,129; Brown Swiss, \$7,345; Ayrshire, \$7,138; Jersey, \$6,768; Milking Shorthorn, \$6,376.

An international event, the show will be open to entries of these six breeds from the United States and Canada. It will be sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, its Farm Show Commission, and the Pennsylvania Dairy and Allied Industries Association. The show and parking will be free.

State Secretary of Agriculture Leland H Bull said the show will afford dairy enthusiasts and the public generally their first opportunity for seeing the best dairy animals from both sides of the Border at a Pennsylvania event. The show, he said, will be primarily an educational program that is designed to improve individual herds and to strengthen the whole dairy industry.
