The 129 cows, two bulls and 27 heifers met a steady market at the June 24 auction of dairy cattle.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-540; Guerneys \$150-225, and other breeds \$150-250. Stock bulls were \$140-185, and stock heifers \$65-200.

At the June 22 sale of horses, ponies and mules, 317 head sold at steady prices. Riding horses brought \$125-325, driving horses \$125-200, and killing horses 7-7½ cents a pound. Pony mares were \$40-110 and geldings \$30-125.

Hog receipts at the June 24 auction were 344 head. Prices were mostly 25 lower.

Retail hogs went to local butchers at 18-19.25, and grades 1 to 3 went to the packers at 17.50-18.25. Heavyweight hogs brought 16 25-17 25. The 16 shoats on sale brought \$6-12 per head.

The 109 calves at the June 22 auction brought steady prices. Choice and prime vealers sold at 30-34, good and low choice 26-30, standard 23-26, and cull and common 18-23
