Next meeting of the group will be a family supper picnic on Thursday, August 6 at 6:30 p.m. at the pool.

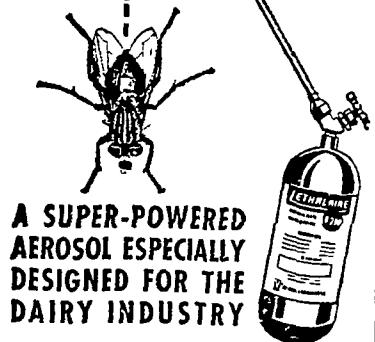

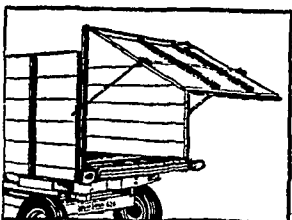
