The junior leaders present were Kaye Smith, Joyce Hoist, Sandra Snyder, June White and Jane Smith.

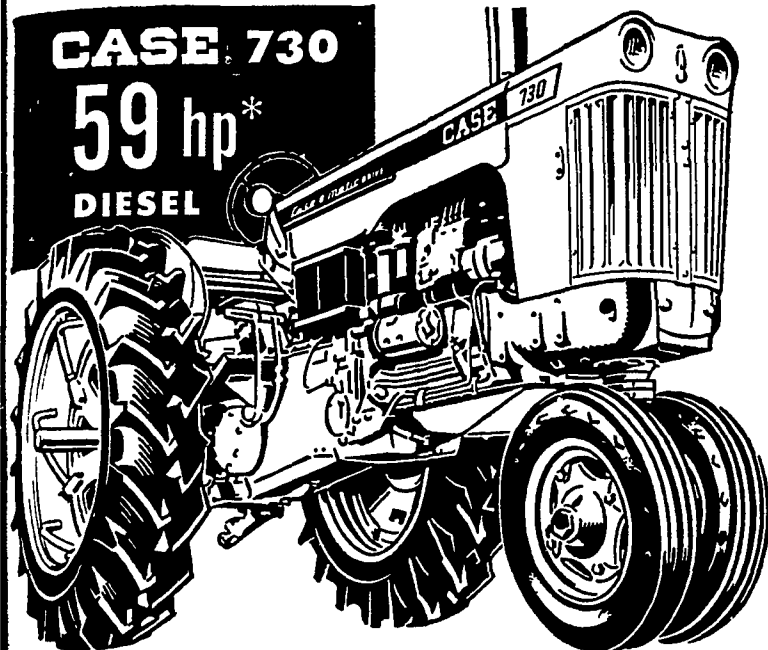
