

# Weekly Broiler Report

Hatcherymen in Pennsylvania set 1,104,000 eggs for commercial broiler production during the week ending July 4, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. This was a decline of 15 per cent from the previous week but an increase of 2 per cent over last year. The 3-week total was down 6 per cent from the comparable period a year ago. Placements were 19 per cent below a week earlier and 6 per cent below last year. The 10-week total was 5 per cent above a year earlier. Inshipments of broiler-type chicks

for the past 10 weeks totaled 833,000 or double that of last year. Outshipments of 1,247,000 were down 36 per cent.

Settings in the 22 major producing states were 3 per cent below the previous week but 4 per cent above a year ago. The 3-week total rose 3 per cent over last year. Placements fell 3 per cent from a week earlier but increased 2 per cent over the previous year. The 10-week total remained about the same.

Demand fair for light and heavy type hens. Offerings barely adequate on both classes as flock owners holding birds for additional egg production. Prices paid at farm for heavy type hens 14-15¢ mostly 15¢. Light Type hens 7-8 mostly 7½-8¢.

## Delmarva

Live broilers and fryers increased slightly with a good demand for moderate auction offerings. Ready to cook demand irregular ranging from slow to fair in instances for next week developing slowly though prices generally not attractive to local processors. Delivered prices unchanged but very competitive with other producing areas.

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the weekend was 744,000 head compared to the 694,000 head last weekend. Live prices at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 a.m. Friday ranged from 17.0 to 18.3 for reported purchases of 1,075,900 head including 555,900 head offered and sold at Selbyville, Del. Thursday. At the auction 47 per cent of the sales were at 17.0 to 17.4.

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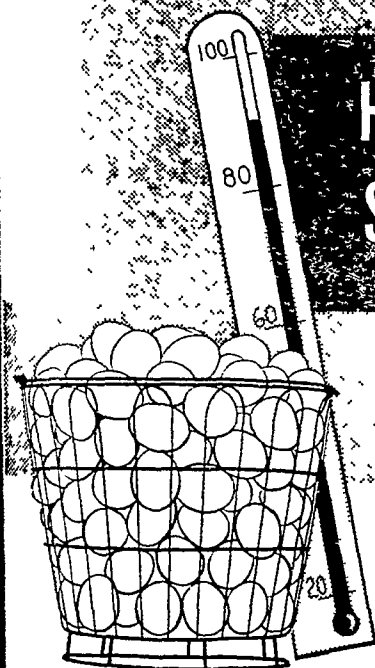
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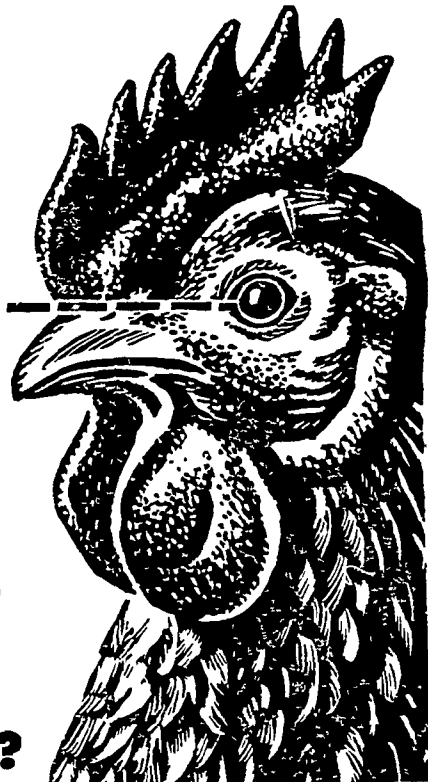
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
