Dairy cattle met a steady but slow market at the July 22 auction as 205 cows, 8 bulls and 39 heifers changed hands. Fresh holstein cows brought \$275-500; Guernseys \$150-240, and other breeds \$150-250. Stock bulls brought \$140-250 and stock heifers \$65-210.

The 243 head of horses and ponies met a steady auction on July 20 with killer horses \$100 higher. Riding horses changed

hands at \$125-250, driver horses \$100-370; pony mares \$40-100 and pony geldings \$125. Killer horses brought to 6½ cents a pound.

Hogs sold steady to higher at the July 20 auction as 284 head changed hands. Tail hogs to local butchers were 19-20; grades 1 to 3 went to the packers at 18.5-19, and heavyweight hogs brought 18-18.50. Sows sold 10.50-14.

Calves sold steady at the July 20 auction with 120 offered. Choice and prime vealers brought \$30-34, good low choice 26-30, standard 26, and cull and common 23.

Lambs weighing 70 to 100 pounds brought 19-23.50.

Trading on slaughter steers and heifers generally slow. Steers steady to 25 lower, heifers mainly on average Choice and better, heifers steady to 75 higher, cows strong to 75 higher. Bulls fully 50 up. In Chicago carlot dressed trade, steers beef steady to 1.00 lower.
