DAIRY CATTLE at the July 29 auction met a steady market. A total of 157 cows, 4 bulls and 62 heifers changed hands.

FRESH HOLSTEIN COWS brought \$275-520; Guernseys \$154-270, other breeds \$150-250 and stock heifers \$165-280.

At the July 27 auction of horses and ponies the 178 head brought steady prices. Riding horses were \$125-240, driving horses \$100-200, pony mares \$40-100, geldings \$25-125, and killers 6 to 6½ cents a pound.

The 409 hogs at the July 27

auction brought steady to weak prices. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 19-20, Grade 1 and 3 went to the packers at 18 50-19 00, and heavy weight hogs sold for 18 18-50. Sows were 11-14.

A \$1.00 higher market took the 145 calves at the July 29 auction. Choice and prime vealers were 32-34, good and low choice 28-32, standard 25-28 and cull and common 18-25.

Lambs weighing 70 to 90 pounds sold for 20-25 50.

CATTLE — Receipts for the four days 22,100 compared with 21,200 last week and 23,500 year ago, twelve market supply 201,000 compared with 193,500 last week and 168,000 year ago. Slaughter steers steady to 25 higher, slaughter heifers over 900 lbs. mostly steady, weights 900 lbs and down generally 50 lower. Cows 25-75 higher, most advance on Cutter and Utility, bulls 10 higher. In the carlot dressed beef trade, steer beef steady to 1. xxx 75 higher with Choice 700-800lb. carcasses up most, heifer beef steady to 50 higher with 500-600 lb carcasses only steady, cow beef 1.00-1.50 higher.

SLAUGHTER STEERS: Four and a half loads Prime 1225-1300 lbs. 25.25, High Choice and Prime 1150-1400 lbs. 24 25-25 00.

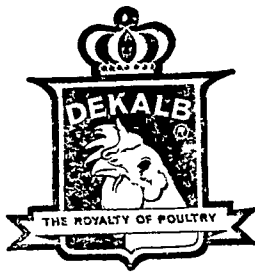
