Tobacco Yield Expected To Be Above Last Year

The August 1 forecast for tobacco production in the Keystone State shows improvement from last month, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. Production is set at 49.4 million pounds with a yield of 1900 pounds per acre. Anticipated production is one per cent below 1963 and 9 per cent below the 1958-62 average while yield is 3 per cent above 1963 and 7 per cent above the 5-year average.

Progress of the tobacco crop was behind normal in early July but timely rain greatly
