**Crop Summary**  
**HARRISBURG** — Crop growth continued to make satisfactory progress in most of the Commonwealth this week despite unseasonably low temperatures, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service  
 "It was the coolest week since early June," the Service said in reporting low readings of 37 degrees at Pleasant Mount in Wayne county and 34 at Emporium, Cameron county.  
 Rain early in the period— from a trace to a good soaking—relieved some dry areas. Precipitation was lightest, however, in northeastern and southeastern counties that "still remain very dry," according to the Service's weekly crop and weather summary  
 Elsewhere crop conditions are progressing normally. The only exceptions noted are early apples and peaches that are of good quality but smaller than usual. Recent rains should add size to later varieties, the report noted
