**Robert Groff Has
New Herd Average**

BRATTLEBORO, Vermont — A new herd production average for milk and butterfat has been announced for the Registered Holstein herd owned by Robert C. Groff, Quarryville.

As reported by The Holstein Friesian Association of America, the herd has completed its latest testing year with a per-cow average of 15,106 lbs. of milk and 582 lbs. of butterfat, based on 28 completed lactation records.

Pennsylvania State University supervised the weighing and production testing procedures in cooperation with the official herd improvement programs of the Holstein Association.

This performance level compares favorably to the average U.S. cow's annual output of 7,500 lbs. of milk and 275 lbs. of butterfat. Production averages are calculated on the commonly employed, two milkings per day, 305-day, mature equivalent basis to provide a comparison standard for selection in Registered Holstein breeding programs.

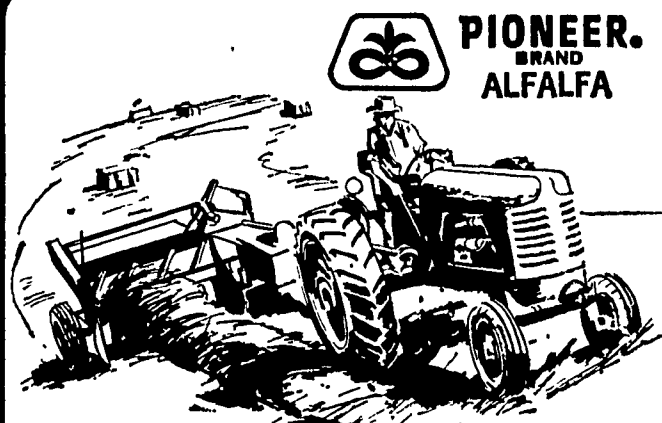

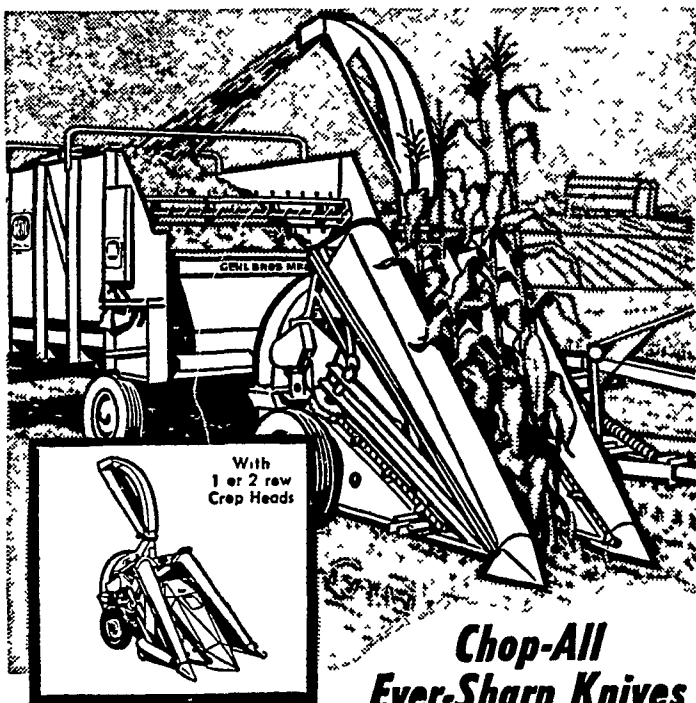
