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mato sauce, chili powder dissolved in small amount of hot chicken broth, mushrooms and salt. Bring mixture to simmering point. Turn mixture into greased 2-quart casserole. Top with Parmesan cheese and dot with butter or margarine. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) about 25 minutes, or until cheese is melted and top is a delicate brown. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

COUNTDOWN
MACARONI BAKE

- 8 ounces elbow macaroni
- 3 large green peppers
- 3 large tomatoes
- 1½ cups shredded process American cheese (6 ounces)
- ½ cup dairy sour cream
- 2 tablespoons minced chives
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper

Cook macaroni in boiling, salted water until tender, yet firm, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain. Meanwhile, cut tops off peppers and remove seeds and membrane if necessary, cut slice from bottoms to let peppers stand upright. Cook peppers in boiling water 5 minutes. Drain. Cut tops off tomatoes and remove pulp, reserving 1½ cups. Blend cheese, sour cream, chives, salt and pepper. Add to macaroni with reserved tomato pulp, mixing thoroughly. Spoon into tomato and pepper shells. Place in lightly greased rectangular 2-quart casserole or baking dish, about 7x11 inches. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 15 minutes, or until heated through. 4 to 6 servings.

DUTCH SPICED TEA

- 1 cup water
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon orange pekoe tea
- ½ teaspoon ground allspice
- Pinch of dried mint leaves
- 6 tablespoons lemon juice
- ¾ cup orange juice
- 2 quarts cranberry juice, heated

Boil water with sugar for 5 minutes. Add tea, allspice and mint. Let steep for 10 minutes. Strain. Add to lemon and orange juice. Add mixture to hot cranberry juice. Reheat slightly and serve hot. 10 cups.

SUMMER SALAD

- 2 avocados, halved and pitted
- 2 tomatoes, halved
- 1-2 tablespoons lemon or lime juice
- ¼ cup finely chopped onion
- 1¼ to 2 teaspoons chili powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups large curd cottage cheese, drained if necessary
- salad greens

Scoop out avocados and tomatoes, turning tomatoes upside down to drain. Cut avocado meat into ¼ inch cubes and sprinkle with lemon or lime juice. Dice tomato pulp into ¼-inch cubes and add to avocado, chill. Meanwhile, mix onion, chili powder and salt into cottage cheese. Shortly before serving, drain avocado and tomato, fold into cottage cheese mixture. Spoon into tomato and avocado shells. Arrange on greens. Makes 8 servings.

NOTE: To serve as a dip, use avocados for shells and serve with corn chips. Dice 1 whole tomato (instead of 2) for the cottage cheese mixture.

Dale Gerber has been employed by the Donegal Union School board on a 10-month basis to cover the period that Miller will be away.



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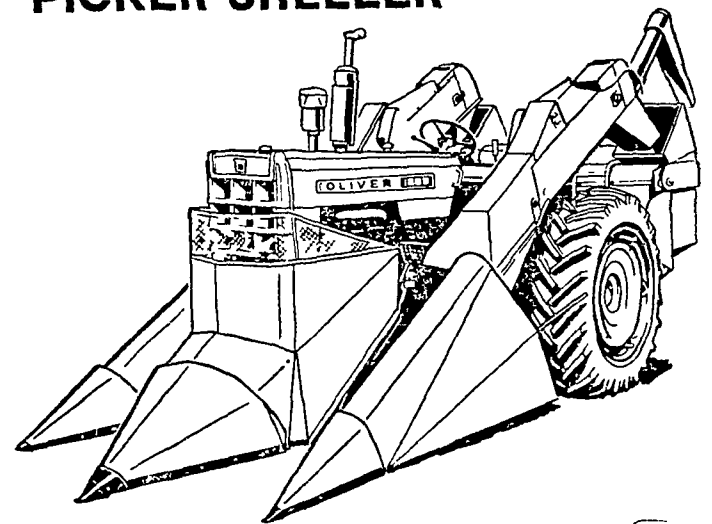
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
