TURKEY NUMBERS UP IN PENNSYLVANIA

HARRISBURG — A total of 16 million turkeys are being raised in Pennsylvania this year, 15 per cent more than in 1963, according to the State Crop Reporting Service.

The number of light breed turkeys — estimated at 289,000 — is up sharply from last year's total of 115,000. The number of heavy breed birds, 1,303,000, is 3 per cent above last year.

The nation's 1964 crop is expected to total 98.7 million turkeys, 6 per cent more than a year earlier.
