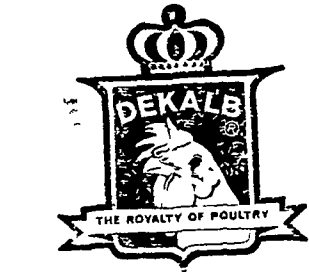
Top Results At Pa. Egg Test

HARRISBURG—Five Pennsylvania entries were among twelve finishing in the first quartile of the seventh Random Sample Egg Laying Test conducted by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. Net income over feed and chick costs, the yardstick used to evaluate performances in the test, ranged from \$2.064 to \$1.773 per bird for entries in the top quartile.

The highest producing pen averaged 237.8 eggs per pullet housed, while the average for the entire test was 213.32.

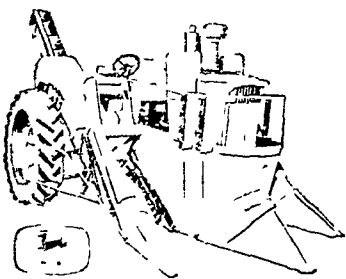

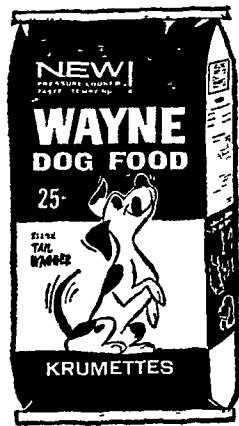

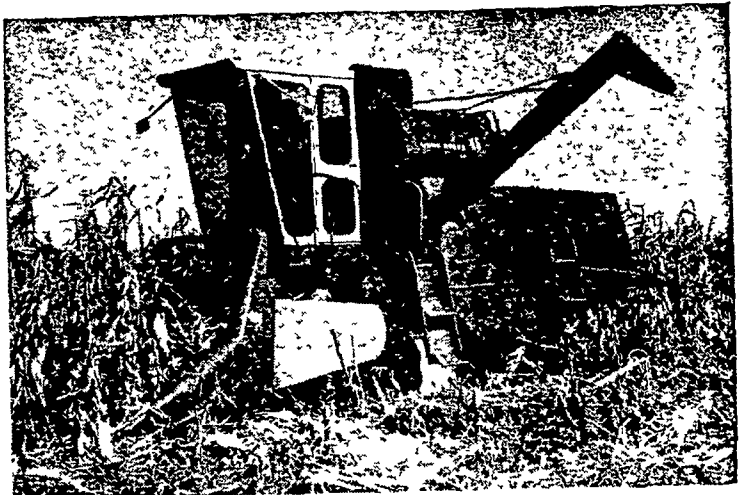
