Home Foundation. However, it was unanimously agreed by the Boards of Directors of both the Poultry Center and the Farm and Home Foundation, that the study strongly supports the plan to develop the Farm and Home Center on the recently donated tract of land. Following the sale of the Poultry Center property, the net proceeds will be transferred to the Farm and Home Foundation for the development of the new Center. Both groups have revealed a fine spirit of united effort and cooperation toward the erection of the badly needed Farm and Home Center.

To take advantage of the land offer and to facilitate early construction of the building, the Directors have approved the conducting of a capital funds campaign covering a period of three months, beginning December 1 of this year. Esbenschade said a concerted appeal among farm families of the county will spear-head the drive for funds, with a corporation and selective public solicitation scheduled for the winter months. Officials of the foundation indicated that the campaign for funds will represent the first time in history that a public appeal of major size will be conducted for this type of project. Two years ago, when plans for the initial fund-raising effort were developing, close to 300 business, industrial and agricultural leaders had

been enlisted to launch the solicitation. Lacking a favorable tax ruling on gifts at that time, it was necessary to postpone the fund-raising effort.

M. M. Smith, well-known County Agricultural Agent, and an Incorporator of the Foundation, today summarized the need for the Farm and Home Center by stating, "The need for a facility of this type in the Lancaster area is long over-due. A great many local civic, agricultural, and business leaders have endorsed plans for a Center of this character. Among other constructive purposes it will serve, the Center will be the focal point of a wide range of farm and home activities on the part of both agricultural and home-making groups. A survey of farm-centered organizations has revealed that nearly forty groups have expressed concern over the need for proper meeting facilities. Apart from the functional purposes the Center would provide, it will be an appropriate symbol of Lancaster County's front rank leadership in agriculture."

As now envisaged, the Center would provide office facilities for numerous agricultural agencies along with meeting and demonstration facilities for farm and home organizations. Being located approximately in the center of the county's population, it would serve as the "hub" of educational activities for both youth and adult programs.

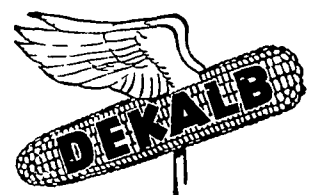
