Such groups as 4-H Clubs, garden clubs, farm organizations, and homemakers' clubs, have a constant need for such a facility. The office space would be rented to agricultural agencies to provide operating income for maintenance of the Center.

One provision of the Center's proposed educational program will be the creation of a perpetual scholarship fund to be used in furthering the education of promising and qualified students in the fields of agriculture and home-making. Establishment of the Center would make it the first of its kind in the State of Pennsylvania. Nearest similar Centers are located in New York State, according to findings of the special study committee which has been at work for the past few years.

The Foundation is chartered under the laws of Pennsylvania as a non-profit corporation and is governed by a Board of Directors including twenty-one men and women Members of the Board are as follows:
