At the Atlantic Rural Exposition held in Richmond, Va. on Monday in conjunction with the State Fair of Virginia, the Lancaster County 4-H Livestock Judging Team placed first among eight entries.

The county team represented Pennsylvania and achieved a score of 1628 points. The next nearest rival was Virginia with 1625 points.

The team from Lancaster county consisted of John Frey, Quarryville R2; Eugene Hosler, Manheim R3; Kenneth Rutt, Quarryville R2; Larry Weaver, New Holland R1.

In the individual placings John Frey finished first, and

Kenneth Rutt, fourth for Pennsylvania.

In the Poultry Judging the county team composed of David Heisey, Sheridan R1; Charles Warfel III, Conestoga R2; Virginia Wivell, Columbia R1, and Dennis Allen, Quarryville R2, gave Pennsylvania third place in a five-state entry.

Virginia Wivell placed third for Pennsylvania on individual ratings with Maryland taking first and fourth and the State of Virginia placing second and fifth.

place the starch in them turns to sugar. If the flavor of stored potatoes becomes too sweet, move them to a room-temperature storage place for a week or two.

If you don't have a storage area that is dark, dry, and well-ventilated with a 45 to 50 degree temperature, it's wise to buy only the quantity of potatoes you can use within a short time.

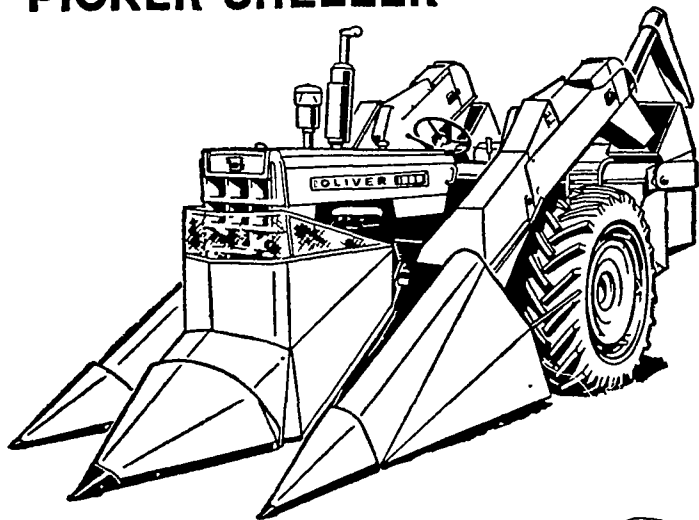
