 resulted from the development and use of more sensitive methods of detecting traces of insecticides. Until

advised differently, keep all dieldrin or heptachlor applications off hay and pasture fields to avoid the residue problem, which could result in condemnation of your milk and animals.

Recommended Insect Control on Alfalfa and Red Clover For 1965

The alfalfa weevil and spittlebug problems will have to be controlled next spring, by applications of Guthion, Meth-

oxychlor, or Malathion — applied in early May, 1965. Webworm on New August, 1964 Alfalfa Seedings Although dry weather has

prevented practically all new seedlings from germinating, there is still a possibility that moisture will develop in time to get the new seedlings established. If and when the new alfalfa seedlings get up, they will be subject to possible feeding by the alfalfa webworm. The webworm has been present in past years and damages the stand by eating the young plants off at the soil level, which results in thinning out the stand. At the first sign of damage, we recommend that the new August seedlings be sprayed. Most effective treatment would be 1 quart of 25% Parathion emulsion per acre. Also effective is carbaryl (Sevin) at rate of one pound active ingredient per acre, which would be one quart of Sevin 4 Flowable or 4/5 quart of Sevin 5 Aqua per acre. Parathion will provide quicker kills, but Sevin will have longer residual toxicity. Be sure to follow precautions when using Parathion. For effective control, use at least 20 to 25 gallons of spray per acre and apply at first sign of injury.

Methoxychlor and Malathion would give fair control of webworm, but not be as effective or probably as cheap as Parathion or Sevin.

LARGER POTS FOR PLANTS OUTDOORS

Here's a gardening suggestion for your growing house plants. Extension flower specialists at The Pennsylvania State University, say, when moving house plants outdoors, double-pot them in larger clay pots lined with peat moss. This gives them a topple-resistant base and helps them to hold constant moisture during the

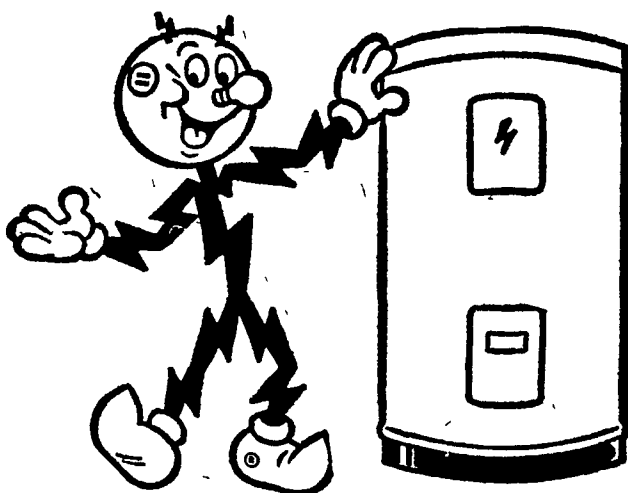

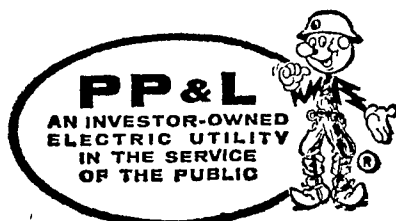
