Good fresh cows were a little stronger and backward springers weaker at the Sept 30 sale. There were 177 cows, 10 bulls and 13 heifers sold.

Fresh Holsteins sold for 250 to 480; Guernseys, 135 to 230, other breeds, 225 to 350. Bulls brought 130 to 185, and heifers, 100 to 225.

At the Horse Sale on Sept 28, 304 head sold at a steady trend. Riding horses brought 125 to 300; driving horses, 125 to 200; killers, 6½ to 7 cents per pound.

Pony mares sold for 50 to 100, and geldings, 25 to 75. At the Hog Sale, also on Sept 28, 413 hogs and 30 shoats were offered.

Hogs retailed at 18.50 to 19. The wholesale price for U.S. Grades 1-3 ranged from 18 to 18.50. Heavyweights brought 17 to 17.75, and sows, 12 to 15.50. The shoats sold for 8 to 16. The trend of the sale was steady.

There were 160 calves received at the Sept 28 sale and these sold at steady to \$1 higher. Choice and prime, 34 to 37.50, good and low choice, 29 to 34; standard, 26.50 to 29, common, 15 to 25.
