The first three positions in the Dairy judging went to Paul Martin, Garden Spot High School; David Galber, Elizabethtown High School; Larry Bieneman, Lampeter-Strasburg High School.

In the Livestock judging the first three places went to David Heisey, Ephrata High School, Leroy Eshelman, Penn

Manor High School, and Bruce Frey, also Penn Manor High School.

In the grand totals for all contests, that decide the final winners, the first three positions went to Eugene Risser, Warwick; Leroy Eshelman and James Heistand, both of Penn Manor High School. They totaled 681, 677 and 659 points, respectively.

The plaque that each year is passed to the school that wins the most total points will go from Ephrata, last year's winner, to Garden Spot High School, the new champs.

The judges for the Fair events this year were the following: Vo-Ag teachers: Lew Ayles, Ephrata; Wm Fiedt, Solanco; Eugene Dougherty, Garden Spot.
