NEW FILM — PRESCRIPTION FOR SAFETY

"Prescription for Safety," a new film dealing with safe handling of agricultural pesticides, is being released by California Chemical Company as part of the chemical industry's continuing program to emphasize the need to follow precautions found on product labels

The motion picture is slated for release to grower groups, agricultural extension agents, farm associates, and farm youth organizations

A non-commercial concept, the film features "Brand X" chemicals. According to L. F. Czufin, Calchem's Manager of Advertising & Public Relations, any agricultural chemical com-

pany can adapt this safety

film for their use and distribution by adding a film "leader" and "trailer" containing their firms introduction and signature. The movie has already been shown to member companies of the National Agricultural Chemicals Association and prints are being made available at cost," Czufin says.

Stressing common sense practices, the 18-minute film follows a farmer through a workday made safe by the proper mixing, applying, and storing of pesticides. Destruction of chemical containers, hygienic care and protective clothing are among the subjects treated. It also depicts the helpful role pesticides play in the production of quality, high-yield
