These were, Excellent Nancy Bollinger, Ruth Mellinger, Nancy Risser, Linda Hooper,

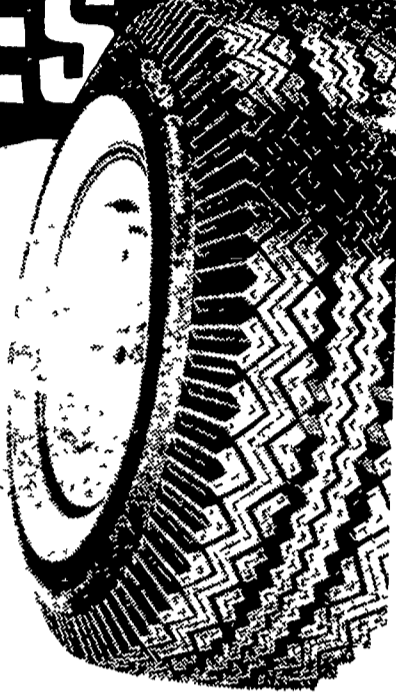
Charles Warfel, Richard Warfel, Ruth Ann High, Susan Atkins and Rebecca Atkins.

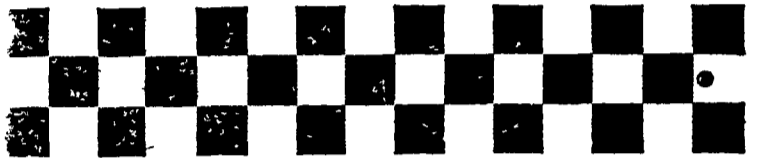

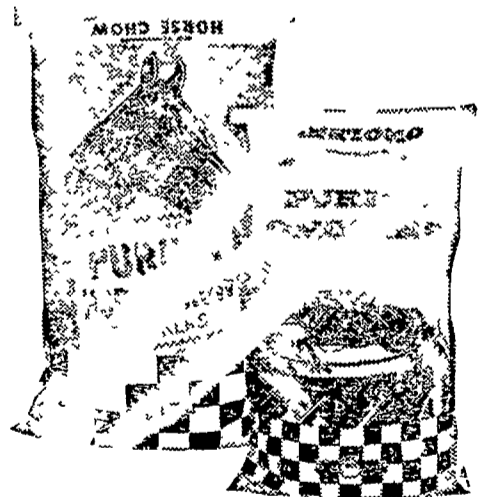
