

Fresh Air Fund Hosts Countians

"Summer's Children," a new 20-minute sound-and-color motion picture filmed mostly in Lancaster County to promote the Fresh Aid Fund of the New York Herald Tribune Newspaper, had its premier showing at the Armstrong Coik Co auditorium last Friday evening. Ninety-three of the rural families were honored for having served as hosts to New York children for 10 years or more.

The movie features local families and their summer visitors from New York. Richard Heit, Ronks, RI, shows Joanne Vasquez New York City how to milk a cow, and Kenneth Koser provides a good time for the kids in his Navon 'Swimming Hole.' Stanley Moore Gordonville RI, blacksmith by trade, spins some magic with a seaming-hot iron hammered over an anvil. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lamb Paradise, set the stage for an outdoor barbecue and a moving bedtime scene featuring Kim Bolling, New York City, and Joseph Karl, Brooklyn saying their prayers before jumping into their bunk beds. The grand finale takes place in the living room of the Charles Leaman family, Ronks, RI, with the entire cast gathered around the piano as Robert Secker, Lancaster, leads 'Pop Goes the Weasel.'

Eugene Flynn, New York City, was also present at Armstrong because of the part he plays in some beautiful scenes taken in Connecticut.

In the 1964 summer season, 600 children spent vacations on 500 Lancaster County farms and "Friendly Town" homes.

Mrs. John Groff, Marietta, who has served as a "Fresh Air" host for 31 years accepted the honor as a representative of the many families who have had youngsters for 10 years or more.

County 2nd In Pa. Entries For Livestock Exp.

Pennsylvania livestock breeders will have 1,462 beef cattle, swine, sheep and horses in the eighth Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition, November 9 to 14 in the State Farm Show Building.

This will be nearly half of the 3,364 total entered from 19 states. H. R. McCulloch, exposition manager, said the Pennsylvania entries will come from 219 farms in 41 counties.

Ohio will be in second place among the states with 690 animals entered by 76 breeders. Other states with entries are Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, South Carolina, Georgia, Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan, Illinois, Missouri and Oklahoma.

Centre will lead Pennsylvania counties with 229 animals in 21 entries, including one of 113 animals from the Pennsylvania State University. This will be the largest single entry in the entire show.

York county will send 206 animals from 30 farms, while Lancaster will have 184 in 38 entries.

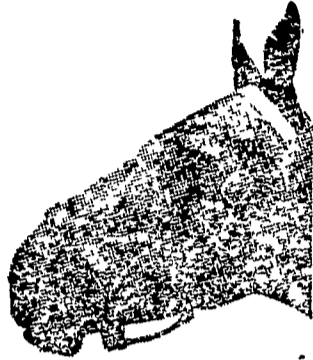
The Fresh Air Fund started one hot Sunday morning in a tiny church in Sherman, a small mountain community in northern Pennsylvania, when the Rev. Willard Parsons described to his congregation conditions in the Lower East Side of New York, where he had previously served. The thought of children suffering in the slums that hot Sunday led his parishioners to send him back to the city to bring sixty youngsters to their homes for vacations.

Now 86 years and nearly a

million youngsters later, the program is still as simple as that. Families in towns, villages and hamlets in 12 eastern seaboard states open their hearts and their homes, and the Fresh Aid Fund brings them children who most need their hospitality and experience in healthful family living. Last year more than 10,000 boys and girls were given 2 week vacations by the 300 Friendly Town Committees.

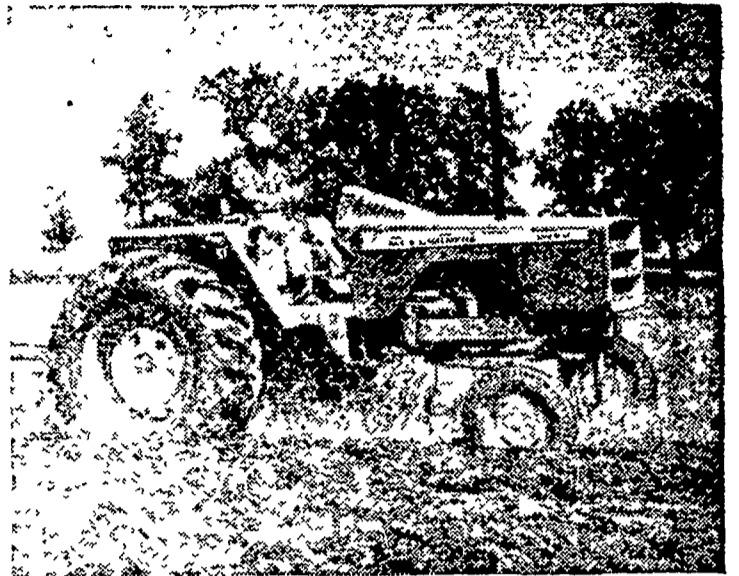

Pulling a big 5 bottom 16" Plow

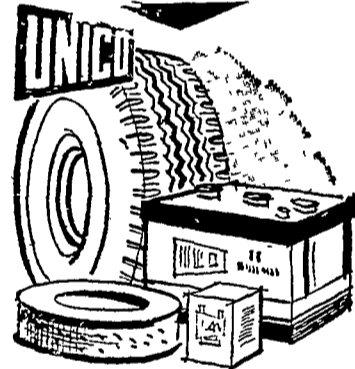

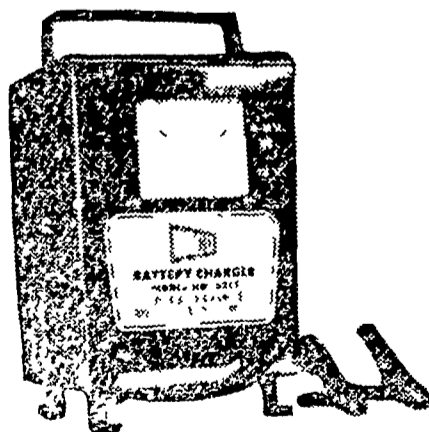
