**Dairy Products Increased** — was an all-time high for the Keystone State. The cheese sparked a 5 per cent increase in the manufacture of dairy products in Pennsylvania in 1963, according to the Federal-State Crop Reporting Service.

The volume of milk used in manufacturing dairy products last year — 2,170 million pounds — was an all-time high for the Keystone State. The previous record, set in 1962, was 2,056 million pounds.

Ice milk production continued to expand — for the 19th consecutive year — with 1963 volume reaching 11.4 million pounds. That was 9 per cent more than in the previous year. Ice cream production of 71.1 million gallons was about the same as in 1962.
