At the hog sale on Nov. 9, 345 head and 20 sheats were offered. Hogs retailed at 17.50-18.25; wholesale (U.S. 1-3) 16-16.75; heavyweights brought 15-16; sows, 12-15; and sheats, 7-13. The trend was 25 lower.

Also on the 9th, 165 calves were received. Choice and prime sold for 34-39; good and low choice, 26-33.50; standard, 20-26; common, 12-20. The trend was steady.
