PA OCT MILK PRODUCTION SAME AS 1958-62 AVERAGE
 Milk cows in Pennsylvania during October produced 537 million pounds of milk, down 10 million pounds from September but the same as the October 1958-62 average. October milk production this year was 4 million pounds less than in 1963 and 27 million pounds less than the record high in October 1962. During the first 10 months this year 5,968 million pounds of milk were produced on Pennsylvania farms or 61 million pounds below the corresponding period a year earlier.

The number of milk cows on Pennsylvania farms in October was 660,000, or 2,000 under a month earlier. Milk cow numbers are down 3 per cent from October 1963 and more than 7 per cent below the October 1958-62 average. There has been an average of 3½ per cent fewer cows the first 10 months of 1964 compared with the same period in 1963. The lack of roughage has prompted some dairymen in the drought areas of the State to cull their herds rather rigorously or sell the milking herd. A few dairymen who sold cows because of the short roughage supplies, have indicated that they are keeping their younger animals. They plan to ship milk when the feed situation is a little brighter.

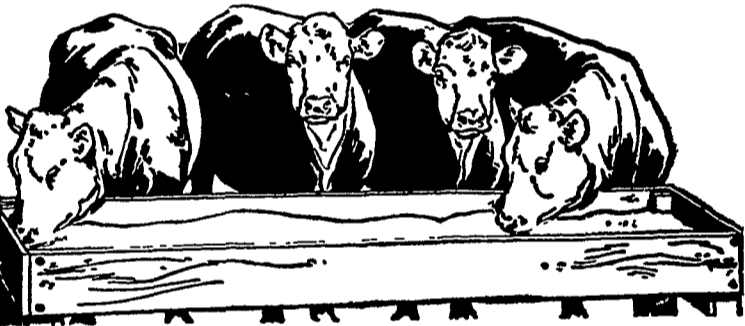
