The Pennsylvania Depait ment of Agriculture has a timely note for turkey fanciers Hens appear to be growing bigger and better

That's the conclusion drawn from a report of 849 hens that were dressed in the department's tenth Random Sample Turkey Test

Average live weight was 167 pounds compared to 1605 pounds a year ago Large white hens showed the biggest gain—15 pounds

Birds this year dressed to 815 per cent of the live weight compared to 809 per cent last year

Finally, 999 per cent of this year's test flock were Grade A Last year, 98.8 per cent were rated Grade A.




