## New Holland Auction

The Thursday sale at the New Holland Sales Stables progressed normally in spite of the holiday. Receipts were slightly below normal; these included 635 cattle, 170 calves, and 11 sheep. Price trends were steady. This sale was not covered in detail by Market New Service because of the Thanksgiving Day holiday.

At the Nov. 25 sale 179 cows, 13 bulls, and 9 heifers were offered. Fresh Holsteins brought 275-450; Guernseys, 150-235; other breeds, 150-300 Bulls brought 125-225, and heifers, 55-250. The trend was steady.

At the horse sale on Nov. 23, 306 head were received Riding horses brought 85-240; driving horses, 85-200; killers, 4½-5 cents per pound Pony

mares brought 25-65, and geldings, 20-50 A steady trend was noted.

Hog receipts at the Nov. 23 sale totaled 367 head and 38 shoats. Hogs retailed at 17-17.50. Wholesale (U.S. 1-3) brought 16-17. Heavyweights, 15-16. Shoats sold for 6-14. The trend was steady.

On the Nov. 23 calf sale 135 head sold at a steady rate. Choice and prime brought 34-37; good and low choice, 26-33.50; standards, 20-26: common, 10-20.

Some weakness prevailed on slaughter steers each of the first three days this week. Fairly liberal marketings coupled with one less slaughtering day factors in the downturn. Also, Prices forced sharply higher last Friday as receipts fell well below normal. Marketings first three days this week locally largest in a month Supply 70-75 percent slaughter steers, around 15 percent heifers. Bulk steers on offer 1350 lbs down but run did include a moderate number of loadlots weighing 1375-1550 lbs. All grades of steers under pressure this week but most bearsness on kinds grading average Choice or better particularly loadlots weighing 1100-1200 lbs. overall finish on steers about like last week. Prime making up around 10 percent of the steer crop.
