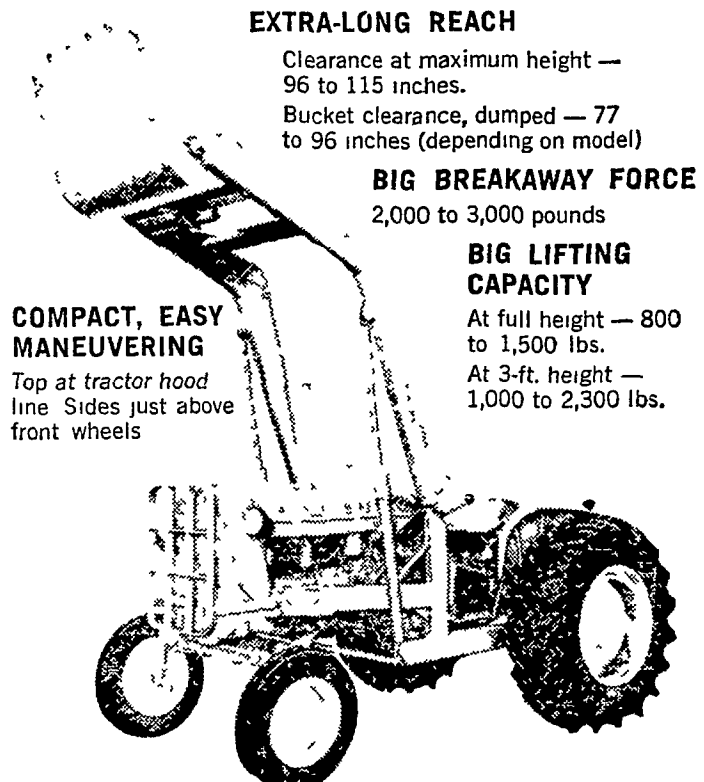
### TIME EXTENDED FOR COMPLIANCE WITH PESTICIDE LABELING CHANGES

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is providing a 3-month extension of time for manufacturers of pesticides to fully comply with amendments to pesticide regulations designed to further protect home-makers and others from hazards in the use of chemical pest controls.

A notice of the action was published in the Federal Register November 26. The authority for requiring registration numbers on pesticide labels was provided by Public Law 305, enacted last May 12.

Following passage of this law, USDA set July 1, 1965, as the deadline for all manufacturers to be in full compliance with the new regulations. This deadline is now being extended to October 1, 1965. The postponement is necessary in order that the required changes on labels of nearly 60,000 pesticides may be made in an orderly manner by USDA's Agricultural Research Service and the chemical industry.

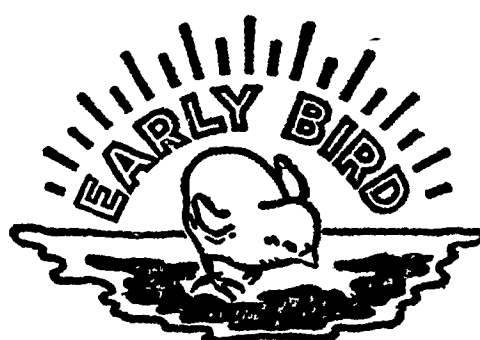
