Eugene Hosler, R D 3, Mannheim, further clinched the team win by finishing in the 13th spot. In the oral reasons competition Frey finished 10th in a field of 116 youths.

Larry Weaver, R D 1, New Holland, the fourth member of Coach M M Smith's squad, scored 48 out of a possible 50 points in judging Hampshire market hogs. This was the highest individual score given by any one judge in any event.

In preparing for their win on the national level the countians had become the Pennsylvania State champions: they won at the Atlantic Rural Exposition, and at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition; and they took third place at the Eastern National Livestock Show at Timonium.

and for constructing cropland or diversion terraces.

The county has been selected as one of four in Pennsylvania to participate in a new ACP practice; the planting of hybrid popular trees. This tree offers opportunities for pulpwood production since it is faster growing than most other species. The cost-share rate on this practice will be 80 percent of the cost, but not to exceed \$13.50 per acre.

To be eligible to participate in any of these practices a farmer must enroll in the program. The ACP county handbook, and more information, may be obtained at the ASCS office.

to the milk room. There it will go into cans. If eventually a bulk tank is desired, it would fit right into this modern, automated operation.

The new barn will measure 45 feet wide by about 150 feet

long. It was found that a crane worked out so well for taking down the barn's large timbers that when it was re-assembled at Reist's a crane was used to hoist them into position. Then the rest of the framing and siding was done by the gang that turned out for the barn-raising.
