#### Weather Forecast

Temperatures for the fiveday period through Monday are expected to average well above normal, with daytime high of 50 degrees and overnight low of 30. Normal for the period ranges from a high of 39 to a low of 24.

Precipitation is expected to total at least one-half inch. This will occur as widely scattered showers during the early part of the period, turning to general showers at the end of the period.
