**Bollinger Cow Joins 1/2-Ton Butterfat Ranks**

The Holstein-Friesian Association of America reports that the 1,701st yearly production record exceeding a half ton of butterfat has been completed by a Registered Holstein cow, ELyndo Vincy Paula 4479123 (GP), owned by Elam Bollinger, Manheim.

The Pennsylvania Holstein's official record of production totalled 25,620 lbs. of milk and 1,003 lbs. of butterfat in 354

days. She started her lactation at the age of 6 years and 1 month and was milked two times daily.

ELyndo Paula was bred in the Bollinger herd. She was sired by Henket Dunloggin Invincible 1193269.

Pennsylvania State University supervised the weighing and sample testing of her production in cooperation with the Dairy Herd Improvement Registry program of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

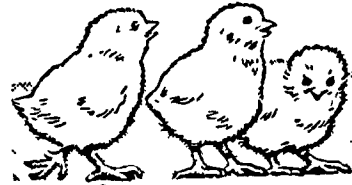
