(Continued from Page 1) sulted in a sharp increase in the number of persons seeking authoritative information on soil conditions, choice of seeds, fertilizers, and the care of trees and shrubbery. He stated that this development, plus the great many farmers coming to the Agricultural Extension Office for helpful information, makes the quarters his agency occupies in

The concentration of non-profit agricultural agencies "under one roof," with adjoining facilities for meetings of farm organizations, garden clubs, Farm Women's groups, and related events, has been cited as holding major advantages. Supporting this belief are the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce and the Manufacturer's Association of Lancaster County, with both organizations expressing the belief "what's good for agriculture in Lancaster County is good for the whole economy and for living in this locality." Part of the fund-raising effort will be directed among major industries, commercial interests, and individuals, the Campaign Steering Committee has announced.

The conduct of a public appeal for funds for the purpose of establishing a Farm and Home Center, represents the first time in many years that such an effort has been organized in behalf of an agricultural project. Upon completion, the Center will be operated by a Board of Directors, on a non-profit basis, with the rental income of agencies located within the building used to help make the over-all facilities self-supporting. All contributions for the project are tax-deductible, under a ruling the Farm and Home Foundation has received from Internal Revenue Service.

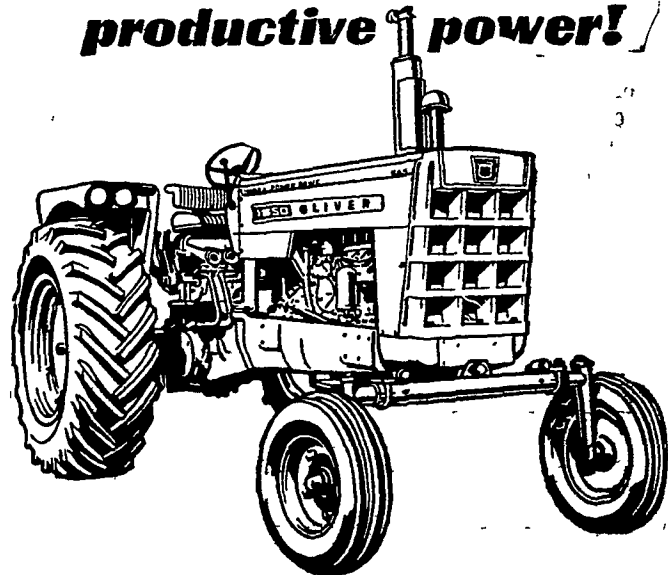
