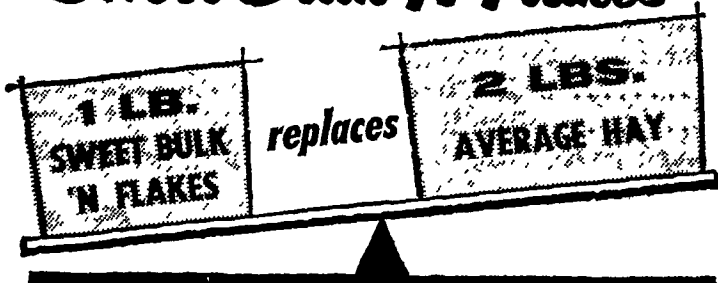

 selves equal satisfaction and pays his fair share.
 "Research and education were what enabled us to produce what we have today, and these activities must continue if we are to meet the demands of tomorrow," the Dean concluded.
 Each year one vacancy occurs on the executive committee for each of the five districts that comprise the Lancaster County Extension Association. The five new members of that committee elected at the annual meeting

were: John J. Herr, northwest district; Reid Wissler, northeast; Mrs. Lloyd Herr, southwest; G. James Kreider, southern; and Mrs. J. Robert Hess, reelected, from the southeast district.
 The meeting concluded with a brief "flannel board" presentation of the facts and philosophy of the cooperative extension service by Frank S. Zettle, Southeast Extension Director, Penn State University. He traced the development of the Extension Service from the movement for public education in Jefferson's day to the establishment of the land grant colleges during Lincoln's administration, to the Hatch Act in 1887 which established Experiment Stations for agricultural research, to the beginning of the cooperative extension service which carried education down into the county level.
 The Extension Service is supported by federal, state, and county agencies and funds, Zettle said. The programs are planned and carried out by the county staff and local leaders, and are backed up by the State University and the USDA with research, publications, specialists, and services. It is a unique arrangement, the speaker concluded.
