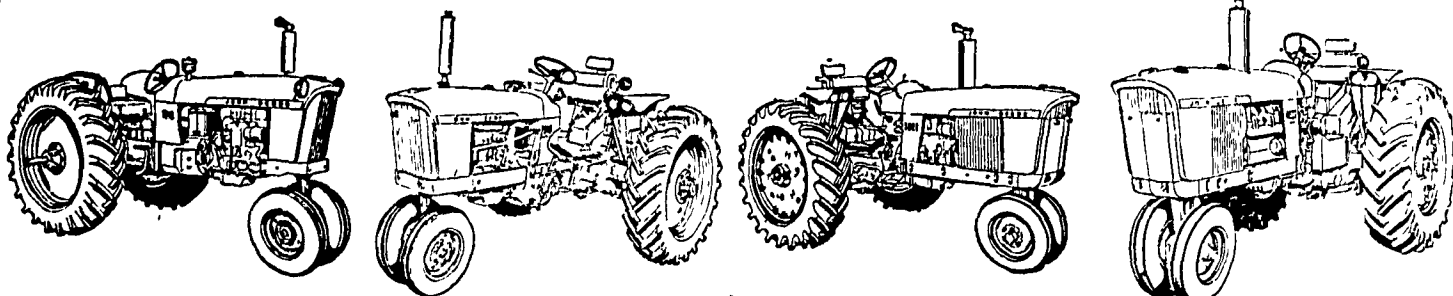
BART FIRE CO. TO HOLD SALE
