### New Holland Auction

Cattle: Slaughter steers very uneven averaging steady. Cows about steady. Bulls steady to strong. Supply included 33 per cent Cows.

Slaughter Steers: High Choice 1050-1300 lbs. 25.00-25.85, with 4 head 26.00-26.60, Low to Average Choice 1000-1250 lbs. 23.50-25.00, Good 22.00-23.75, Standard 19.00-22.25.

Calves: Vealers \$1.00-2.00 lower Choice 37.00-39.50, Good 34.50-37.00, Standard 29.50-35.00, Utility 24.50-30.00, Cull 85-120 lbs. 19.50-23.50, 60-80 lbs. 13.00-18.00.

At the cow sale on Feb 10 a barely steady sale trend was noted for the 232 cows, 8 bulls, and 11 heifers offered Fresh Holsteins brought 275-725; Guenseys, 150-225; other breeds, 150-250 Bulls sold for 140-190, and heifers, 50-150.

The feature of the horse sale, Feb 8, was 20 head of mules that were 5 years old or younger. These mules sold mostly in pairs at 550-800 per pair. Horse receipts totaled 341. Riding horses brought 115-600, driving horses, 115-210; killers, 5½-6 cents per lb, draft horses sold singly for 135-250, and in pairs for 275-550 Pony mares brought 30.80, geldings, 20.80

Hog receipts totaled 544 and shoats 45 at the sale on Feb. 8, and sold steady. Market hogs retailed for 19.20-50; wholesale (US 1-3), 18-18.75;

heavyweight, 17.50-18; shoats brought 7-15 per head, and sows sold for 12.50-16.50 per cwt.

At the calf sale on Feb. 8 receipts of 90 head sold steady. Choice and Prime brought 37-40; Good and Low Choice, 33-36; Standard, 29.50-32.50; Common, 15-25.

#### WEEKLY REVIEW

CATTLE — Receipts for the four days 20,000 compared with 23,800 last week and 26,100 a year ago. Twelve market supply 157,300 compared with 180,800 last week and 180,400 a year ago. Slaughter steers weak to mostly 25 lower. Heifers and cows generally 25 lower. Bulls steady. In the callot dressed beef trade, steer and heifer beef steady to 50 higher, after opening the week lower, cow beef steady.

Slaughter steers and heifers opened the week lower, later receipts were sharply curtailed but with many slaughtering establishments in the East closed Friday only slight improvement was encountered. (Continued on Page 14)
