gather egg whites, instant non-fat dry milk and water at high speed until stiff peaks form. Continue to beat at high speed and add egg yolk mixture, beating only until blended. Fold in 1/2 cup pecans. Sprinkle 1/2 of the crumb-nut mixture in bottom of pan; spoon in lemon mixture; sprinkle remaining crumb-nut mixture over top. Freeze. To serve, cut into squares and garnish with lemon slices and maraschino cherries, if desired. Makes 9 servings.

STEAMED ORANGE-LEMON PUDDING

- 1 medium orange
- 1 medium lemon
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup raisins

- 1 cup coarsely chopped nuts
- 1/2 cup salad oil
- 1 teaspoon ground allspice
- 3 cups biscuit mix

Fresh Orange Sauce*

Wash orange and lemon and cut into quarters; put through food chopper, using medium blade, and saving juices. Combine ground fruit, with juices, brown sugar, molasses, beaten eggs, raisins, nuts and salad oil. Stir allspice through biscuit mix. Add fruit mixture, stirring until blended. Turn batter into a well-greased 2 to 2 1/2 quart mold or casserole.

Cover tightly with lid or aluminum foil tied securely. Place on rack in deep kettle; add enough boiling water to come half way up sides of mold. Steam 2 1/2 to 3 hours, adding more boiling water as needed. Remove from kettle; unmold and serve hot with Orange Sauce.

- ORANGE SAUCE**
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
 - 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
 - 1/2 cup fresh orange juice
 - 1 3/4 cups water
 - 2 tablespoons butter or margarine

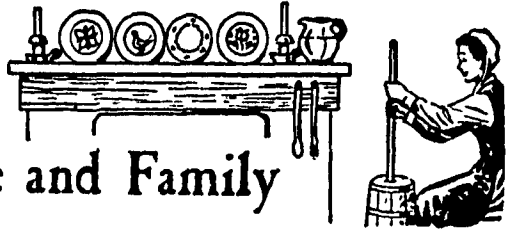
Mix cornstarch, salt, brown sugar and spices in saucepan. Add orange juice, water and butter. Bring to boil, stirring continually. Reduce heat and simmer 2 to 3 minutes. Serve hot. Makes 2 1/2 cups.

Worth Trying

Add a dash of dry mustard or Worcestershire sauce to the cheese sauce when you prepare macaroni and cheese — gives extra flavor to the food.

To make a speedy topping for broiled fish or green vegetables, add a teaspoon of lemon juice and some chopped parsley to one-fourth cup of melted butter.

Use sirup from canned figs as part of the liquid for baking apples. Fill centers of apples with figs and bits of lemon rind.

For a quick meal, mix one can of cream of mushroom soup with enough milk to make it the consistency of medium cream sauce. Heat, then slice hard cooked eggs into the

soup and heat through. Serve hot on toast.

Tips for Keeping

Shears in Good Condition
Sharp cutting tools are a must for home sewing . . . you can't cut fabrics with dull shears.

Use shears and scissors for their intended use . . . that is for cutting fabrics and threads . . . and they'll stay sharp and be ready to use at all times.

Careful handling of your cutting tools pays off. Dropping scissors or shears is one of the worst things you can do to them.

Protect the point of your cutting tools. Between usings, keep each pair of shears in a separate container or on hooks on a storage board.

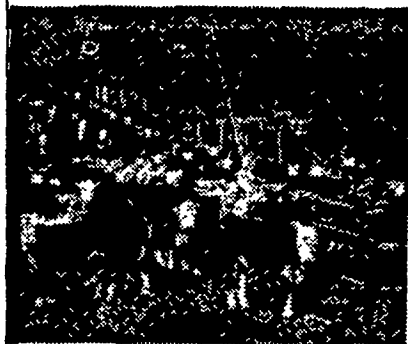

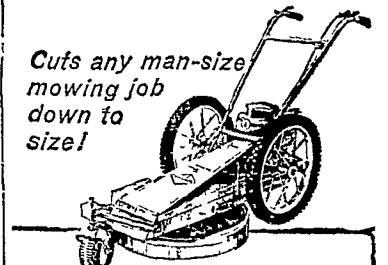
