## Market News Reports New Holland Auction

Receipts at the sale on Feb. 17 totaled 182 cows, 3 bulls, and 12 heifers. Fresh Holstein cows brought 250-450; Guernseys, 150-225; other breeds, 150-250. Bulls sold for 140-355, and heifers 65-140. The trend was slow to steady.

The horse sale on Feb. 15 saw 287 head sell steady. Mules in pairs sold for 275-600, and singly, 140-225; draft horses brought 300-550 in pairs, and 140-250 when sold singly; riding horses, 110-225; driving horses, 110-200; killers, 6-6½ cents per pound. Pony mares sold for 30-85, and geldings, 20-85.

Hog receipts of 584 head and 35 shoats sold steady at the sale on Feb. 15. Market hogs retailed for 19-20.50; Wholesale (U.S. 1-3), 18-18.75; heavyweights, 17.50-18. Shoats brought 8.50-15.50, and sows sold for 12.50-16.50.

A steady trend was also noted for the calf sale on Feb. 15 with 106 head offered. Choice and Prime brought 36.50-38.50; Good and L. Choice, 33-36; Standard, 29.50-32.50; Common, 15-25.


