campaign leaders also pointed out that "substantially more is expected to be raised, with-

in the next ten days, since there are reports outstanding on a total of almost 2,000 prospect cards which were issued by campaign headquarters."

During the past week, the first few reports of men working in the city business-industry phase of the campaign began to add to the drive's total reports. This latter unit began its solicitation on February 16 and the volume of reporting will be stepped up

early next week, officials stated. The city units are aiming to help raise at least one-third of the \$375,000 campaign goal; while the Farm Gifts Division carries the re-

sponsibility for two-thirds of the total goal.

Districts that are among the highest in reporting, to date, include the Landisville area where Co-Chairmen, J. William Snively and J. Wilbert Carpenter, have reported 55 contributions for \$5,174.60, the Manheim Area, with Clarence Keener and John Henry Hess, Co-Chairmen, reporting \$4,874 from 81 contributors; the Letitz Area, Forney Longenecker and Jesse Balmer, Co-Chairmen, reporting \$4,410.00; the Willow Street-New Danville area, where Amos S. Rutt, Chairman, has turned in \$4,398.00 from 55 donors, the Eden-Oregon area, with Chairman Eugene G. Hoover, reporting 46 contributions totaling \$3,635.00; the Rohrerstown area, Earl H. Noll, Chairman, with 41 pledges and gifts of \$3,446.00, and the Quarryville rural area, George Knight, Chairman, reporting 75 gifts for \$3,302.00 total.

Mr. Brubaker and Mr. Skiomme have urged all canvassers to re-double their efforts, now, in making their contacts, so that the Farm Gifts phase of soliciting can be completed within the coming week.

The funds are being sought to erect an agricultural center, near Lancaster, and to provide a scholarship fund for deserving students majoring in agricultural studies following their completion of High School. A 10-acre site has been pledged as a "challenge" gift in the campaign by an anonymous donor. Final plans for the construction of the center will be influenced by the funds raised in the current drive, campaign leaders have pointed out earlier.

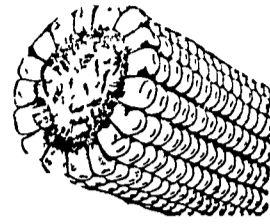
