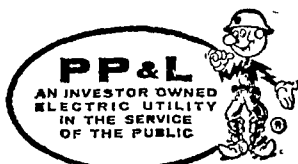

The corn growing contest winners received trophies, plaques, vise-grip wrenches, seed corn, and certificates for their year's efforts in achieving efficient corn production.
