6 slices process American cheese
Make waffles according to your favorite recipe. For topping, combine all ingredients, except cheese. Spread mixture on each waffle section. Top each with a cheese slice. Broil 1 or 2 minutes or until cheese is melted. Serve immediately. Makes 6 servings.

TUNA-FRUIT SALAD

- 2 cans (7-oz.) tuna, drained
- 1 orange, peeled, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 unpeeled apple, diced
- 1 cup seedless grapes, cut in halves
- 1/2 cup coarsely broken walnuts
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- Salad greens
- Lemon quarters
- Paprika

Flake drained tuna into medium size pieces. Combine tuna, orange, apple, grapes and walnuts. Blend mayonnaise, lemon peel and lemon juice. Stir half of the blended mayonnaise through the salad ingredients lightly. To serve, spoon salad onto crisp salad greens; garnish with lemon quarters and sprinkle with paprika. Serve remaining salad dressing.

Why Crops Need Limestone

Two important ingredients needed by crops are calcium and magnesium. Both are regularly lost through the soil by the following ways:

- (1) By leaching, which is a slow leaking away, a normal process where there is rainfall.
- (2) By crop removals, Legumes, such as hay and other greens, are taken off the fields, instead of plowed under.
- (3) By general use of the soil.

Because of this loss, the soil becomes what is known as high in acid. Putting on limestone may supply calcium and magnesium and correct the soil acidity at the same time.

It has been shown in experiments by agricultural colleges and experiment stations that for every dollar spent for limestone, from \$3 to \$15 are returned to the farmer through increased yields.

The U.S. Government is so thoroughly convinced of the worth of applying limestone that about one-half of the cost is granted free when application is made for it. This is to encourage farmers to be certain to use limestone.

It does pay to use limestone!
