The cow sale on Mar. 3 was slow but steady with 109 cows, 4 bulls, and 10 heifers. Fresh Holsteins brought 250-445; Guernseys, 150-220; other breeds, 150-275. Bulls sold for 125-190 and heifers 65-145.

At the horse sale on the 1st, 408 head were offered. Mules in pairs brought 250-650, and singly, 125-290. Draft horses in pairs brought 275-650, and singly, 140-250. Riding horses sold for 120-240, driving horses, 110-295; fillies 6-6½ cents per pound. Pony mares brought 30-85, and geldings, 25-85. The trend was steady.

Hogs also sold steady at the sale on Mar. 1 with 427 head received. Market hogs retailed for 19.50-20.50; wholesale (US 1-3), 18-18.75; heavy-weights, 17.75-18. Sows sold for 12.50-15.

Calves sold at \$1 lower at the Mar. 1 sale with 122 head offered. Choice and Prime brought 35-38; Good and Low Choice, 33-34.50; Standard, 30-32.50; Common, 15-25.

CATTLE — Receipts for the four days 21,700 compared with 25,700 last week and 23,100 a year ago. Twelve market supply 173,900 compared with 176,800 last week and 174,800 a year ago. Slaughter steers strong to 25 higher, heifers steady to 25 lower. Cows 25 to mostly 50 higher, bulls 50 higher. In the carlot dressed beef trade, steer and heifer beef very uneven throughout the week with steer beef steady to 50 lower, heifers beef steady to 50 higher with the advance on good grade, cow beef mostly 1.00 higher.
