

Weekly Broiler Report

BROILER PLACEMENTS INCREASE 20 PERCENT

Placements of broiler chicks in the Keystone State during the week ending February 27, totaled 865,000, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. The placements increased 20 percent from the previous week but declined 5 percent from a year ago. Settings for broiler chicks totaling 1,268,000 decreased 1 percent from the previous week but increased 5 percent from last year. In-shipments of broiler type chicks during the past 10 weeks totaled 431,000 or 13 percent above the comparable period in 1963-64. Outshipments (2,249,000) were about 28 percent above the comparable period a year earlier.

Placements in the 22 major-producing states totaling 44,569,000 chicks increased 2 percent from the previous week and 5 percent from a year earlier. The 10-week total increased 6 percent from last year. Settings of 59,588,000 remained about the same as

the previous week but advanced 3 percent from a year ago. The 3-week total increased 3 percent from a year ago.

Eastern Pa. & N.J.

Demand for light type hens continues fair. Supplies adequate. Offerings of heavy type hens barely adequate. Demand spotty but fair overall. Limited quantities of 13-14# heavy type hens turkeys sold off farms at 32¢. Prices paid at farms: Light type hens 57¢ mostly 66½¢; heavy type hens 19-21¢ mostly 19¢.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 720,000 head compared to 607,100 head last weekend.

Prices paid and reported purchases for the 24 hour period ending 10:30 a.m. Friday: broilers and fryers, 16-9-18 5, 1,025,500 head, including 453,200 head offered and sold at Eastern Poultry Growers Exchange Thursday.

Twenty-six percent of the broilers and fryers sold for 17.5-17.7.

The Delmarva broiler feed ratio for the week ending 2/28/65 was 3.3, up 3 points from last week. Mash prices averaged \$103.06, and broilers averaged 17 cents per pound.

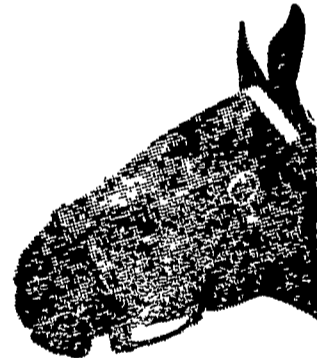
