Keep the machine covered when not in use and you'll cut down on the dust that gcts into the working parts. A small brush is a must for removing lint

At least once a month clean the machine If you do a lot of sewing you may need to clean it more often Before oiling the machine is a good time to use the lint brushnemove the throat plate and clean the bobbin carrier Use the brush wherever you see lint on machine parts

The manual that came with your sewing machine is your best guide for oding instructions. One dicp of oil in each place is enough Never use too much oil on the machine and be sure to use the right kind of oil

When the thread breaks and a tiny piece gets caught in the bobbin, turn the balance wheel slightly to release the thread, then draw it out Tweezers are useful for this.
