## Rommel Controls Horn & Heel Fly

Horn and heel flies can be controlled effectively by feeding rommel, a systemic insecticide, in a mineral salt mixture free choice to cattle on pasture

Scientists of ARS and the Georgia Agricultural Experiment Station obtained 89- and 97-percent control of horn flies in tests with rommel. In earlier tests to control heel

Receipts at the Mar 17 sale were 165 cows, 9 bulls, and 3 heifers. The tone was slow to steady with fresh Holsteins bringing 250-450, Guernseys, 140-210, other breeds, 140-250. Bulls sold for 135-210, and heifers, 65-160.

At the horse sale on Mar 15, mules and draft horses sold slow, with interest in riding horses active and higher.

Mules in pairs brought 275-500; singly, 140-185. Riding horses sold for 135-340; draft horses, 125-225; killars, 6-6 1/2 cents per pound. Pony mares brought 80-85; geldings, 25-65. Receipts totaled 331 head.

Hogs sold 25 higher at the Mar 15 sale with 550 head offered. Market hogs marketed for 19-20; wholesale (U.S. 18), 18-18.75; heavyweights, 17.50-18.25. The fifteen steers offered brought 7-15, and some sold for 12.50-14.50.

A steady trend prevailed at the Mar 15 calf sale with 131 head sold. Choice brought 33-37.50; Good and Low Choice, 32-33; Standard, 29-32; Weak mon, 12-25.
