The five entries judged best on-foot were: (1) York, Willow Glen; (2) Spotted Poland, Warren Leininger; (3) Hampshire, Bill and Bob Fisher; (4) Hampshire, Bill and Bob Fisher; (5) York, Geo. Cogley.

In the final analysis, the best five carcasses were evaluated as follows:

1— A Yorkshire entered by Willow Glen Farm; 31.7-inch carcass length; 1.1 inch backfat; 5.9 sq. inch loin-eye; 42.1 ham-loin percentage.

2— A Chester White entered by John Hastings; 29.9-inch length; 1.2 inch backfat; 5.2 sq. inch loin-eye; 41.4 ham-loin percentage.

3— A Yorkshire entered by George Cogley; 29.4 inch length; 1.4 inch backfat; 4.8 sq. inch loin-eye; 40.3 ham-loin percentage

4— A Hampshire entered by Bill and Bob Fisher; 29.8 inch length; 1.2 inch backfat; 4.2 sq. inch loin-eye; 40.0 ham-loin percentage

5— A Spot entered by Clair Hartman; 27.9 inch length; 0.9 inch backfat; 5.2 sq. inch loin-eye; 42.1 ham-loin percentage.

sorghum, and 212 acres of barley. The diversion will be from base acreages of 5146 acres, or 68.4 percent of the base, on the signed farms. Base acreage for all eligible feed grains farms in Lancaster County totals 130,595 acres.

The Chairman explains that the 1965 feed grain program in general is similar to that for 1964. Growers may participate by diverting at least 20 percent of their feed grain base acreage and devoting it to conserving use (or they may plant specified substitute crops upon request, with a

reduction in diversion payments). In return, they become eligible for acreage diversion payments, price-support payments, and loans on their entire 1965 production of corn, grain sorghum, and barley.

This year, for the first time, eligible feed grain and wheat cropland acreage may be substituted provided producers sign up and participate in both programs.

While it is not necessary for farmers to indicate at signup whether they plan to use the substitution provision, it is suggested that interested producers discuss details with the ASCS county office people, since the use of substitution provisions can materially affect the levels of payment.

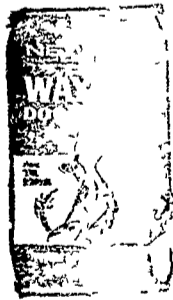

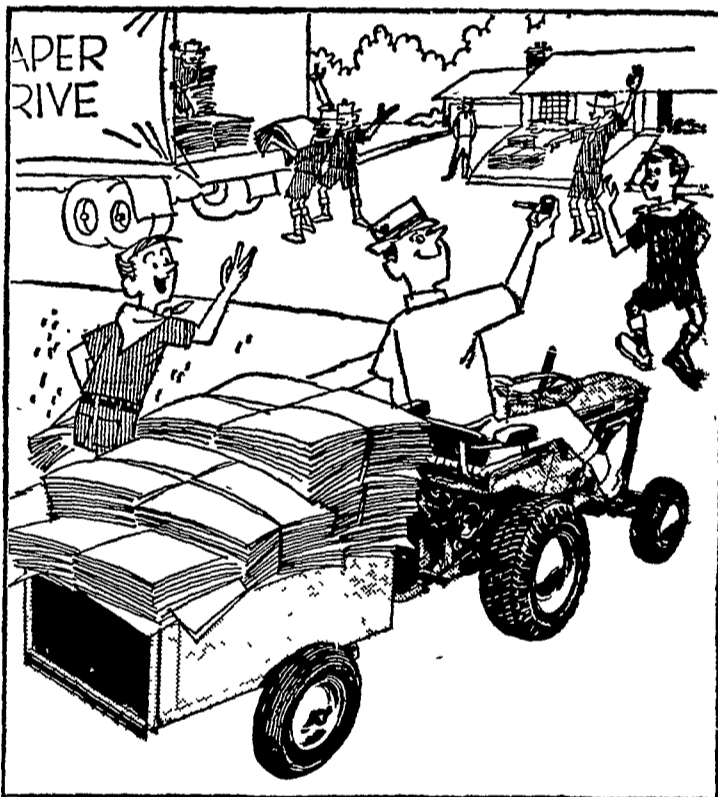
