 onella and the egg product must be pasturized if tests are positive. The pasteurization requirement would apply to all egg products except whites beginning Jan. 1, 1966. The amended regulations would also require that all liquid or frozen egg whites be: (1) pasteurized, or (2) tested for Salmonella, or (3) heat treated and tested for Salmonella, beginning June 1, 1965. Liquid egg whites, except for those produced from pasteurized liquid, would be required to be heat treated in dried form and tested for Salmonella beginning June 1, 1965.

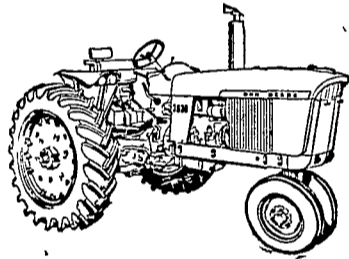

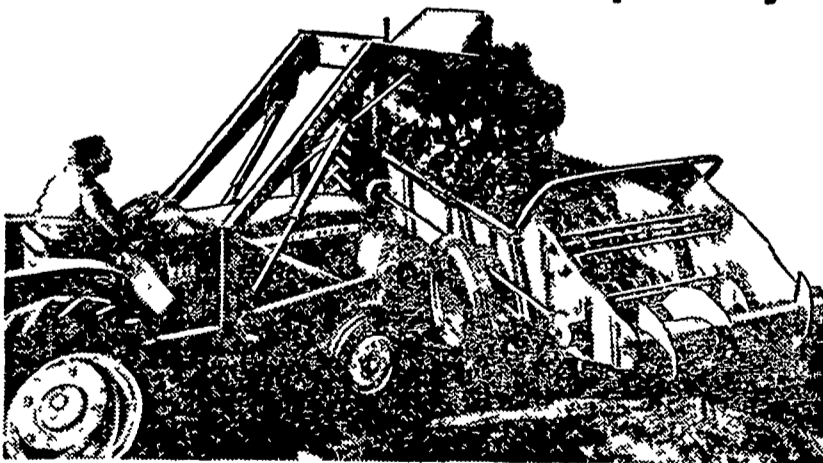
