The new state plow kings will succeed the current titleholders—Raymond L. Swope, Greencastle, R1, contour, and Jesse C. Krout, Jr., York, R1, level land—who won the 1964 Pennsylvania contest last July at Edenville, Franklin county.

The new state champions will qualify for the National Plowing Matches whose winners will go on to the World Plowing Contest next Oct. 8-9 at Oslo, Norway. The time and place for the 1965 U.S. meet have not yet been set.

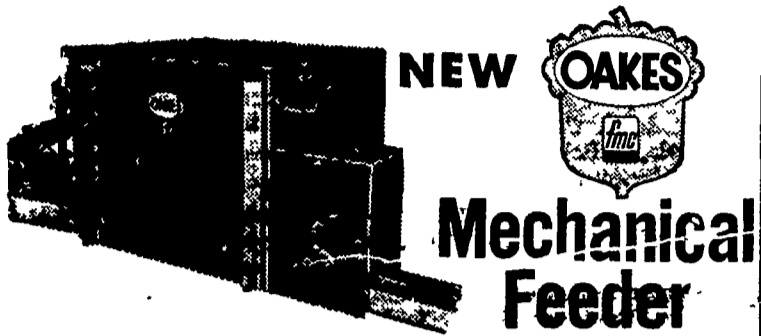
Site of the state meet at Hershey will be on the Hershey Estate Farms where fields that were plowed in the 1958 National Matches and on a number of occasions in state contests again will be visited by the competing sodbusters.

The state contest, Grey stated, will be held in conjunction with a Forage Field Day planned for August 27 by the Pennsylvania Grassland Council of which Chris M. Nissley, Landisville, is president.

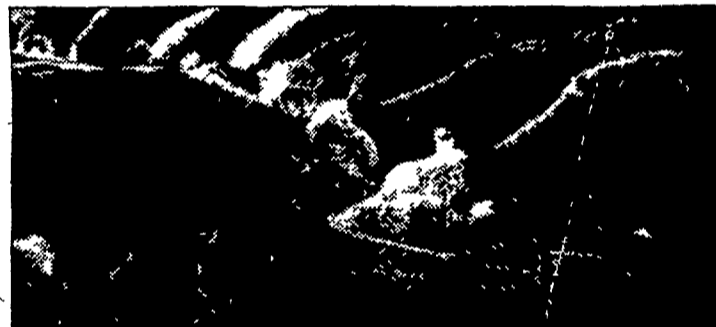
