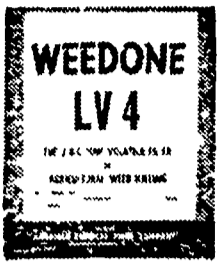

it promises greater stability than we have known in the recent past, also augurs great change. Some of these changes are already taking place and more will undoubtedly follow. Unfortunately, change helps some and hurts others. This has always been true in virtually every activity of man. In the market egg industry, some poultrymen and some areas of production may be forced out of business. No organization or governmental agency can prevent this, but, fortunately, there are laws and programs available to help those affected readjust to other productive pursuits. NEPPCO will help such poultrymen to obtain assistance from the proper governmental agencies whenever and wherever it can," Metz declared.

Turning to the challenges now facing the industry, Metz announced that the Board of Directors had taken the following actions:

1. Authorized a study be undertaken immediately to determine what the long-range course of the industry in the Northeast might be and how

NEPPCO can best serve such an industry.

2. Approved a series of recommendations by its Egg Marketing Committee to upgrade the quality requirements of eggs traded on the New York Mercantile Exchange. These recommendations will now be presented to the Exchange for consideration and action. If adopted, they will bring quality standards of the Exchange a big step closer to those currently demanded in the retail trade.

3. Approved a compromise proposal for resolving the nationwide egg weight controversy and urged its Egg Marketing Committee to continue its work with USDA and oth-

er poultry organizations to solicit nationwide support for the proposal and effect early adoption in key egg producing states.

4. Endorsed a proposal for the establishment of egg "clearing houses" in key egg states for the purpose of (a) providing market reporting services with more comprehensive information of inventories and egg movements outside the New York market area, and (b) aiding in clearing surpluses before they reach the New York market.

5. Ordered immediate action on a recommendation of a Special Committee of New England egg industry leaders that NEPPCO move as rapid-

ly as possible in the preparation of a case petitioning the U. S. District Court of Massachusetts to vacate the Boston "consent decree." Such action, it is maintained, will strengthen and stabilize the egg market for all of New England.

6. In a companion move, the Board established a standing committee to be known as the "NEPPCO Egg Marketing Advisory Committee for New England" to serve as a "watch dog" of the market after the restraints of the consent decree have been lifted.

7. On the question of co-sponsoring another "Eastern

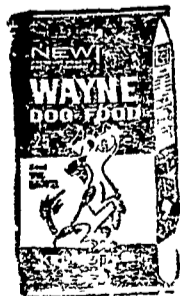

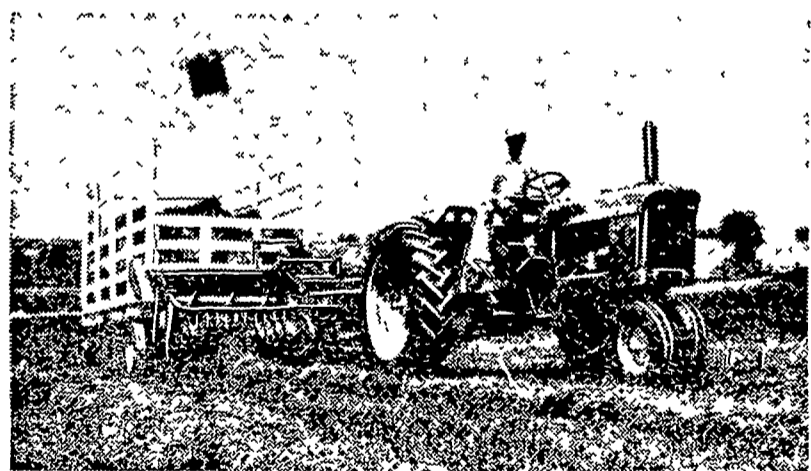
