Bulls 50 lower. Few feeders fully steady. In the carlot dressed beef trade steer and heifer beef 50-1.25 higher. Cow beef steady to 1.00 lower, decline on Canner and Cutter. Although receipts both locally and around the circuit were increased this week, a higher dressed beef trade offset any (Continued on Page 3)
